We have a **two clear bags per household** limit for weekly garbage collection -



- 40 lb/18 kg maximum per bag
- No more than 10% of recyclables allowed per bag

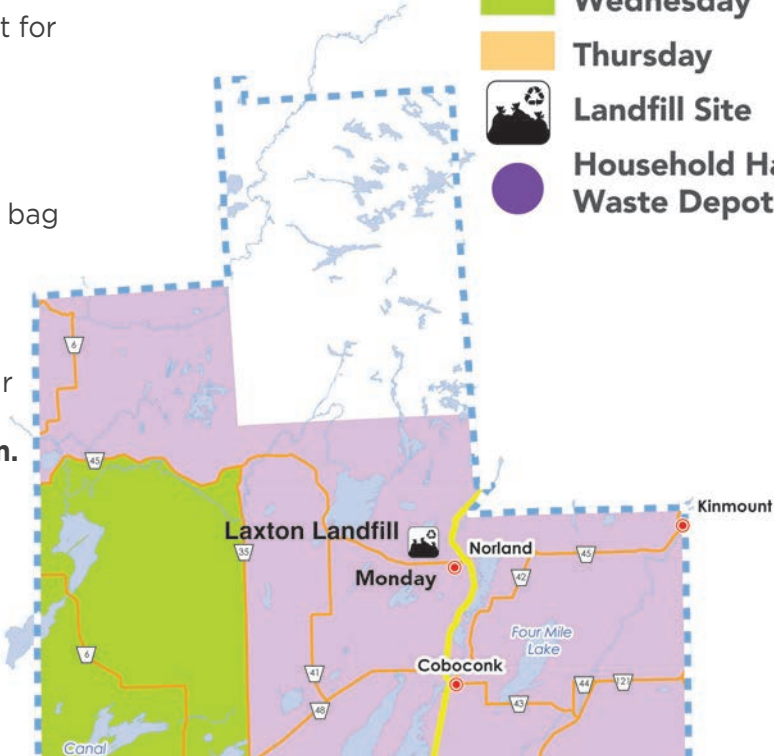

Recycling reminders for 2023

Textile recycling: Textile recycling is available for drop-off at all five landfills. Acceptable materials are clothing, linens and shoes. Items should be in clear bags and not mixed in with other recycling items. For a full list of recyclable textiles visit www.kawarthalakes.ca/textiles

Mattress recycling: Mattresses will only be accepted at the Lindsay Landfill, or through curbside pick up. This will ensure all mattresses are recycled. To date our mattress recycling program has diverted over 10,000 mattresses from ending up in our landfills.

Bulky plastics: Bulky plastics are accepted at the Lindsay Landfill for recycling. This includes items such as plastic beverage crates (milk crates), plastic lawn furniture, clean plastic drums, totes, empty garbage/recycling bins and clean plastic buckets and pails.

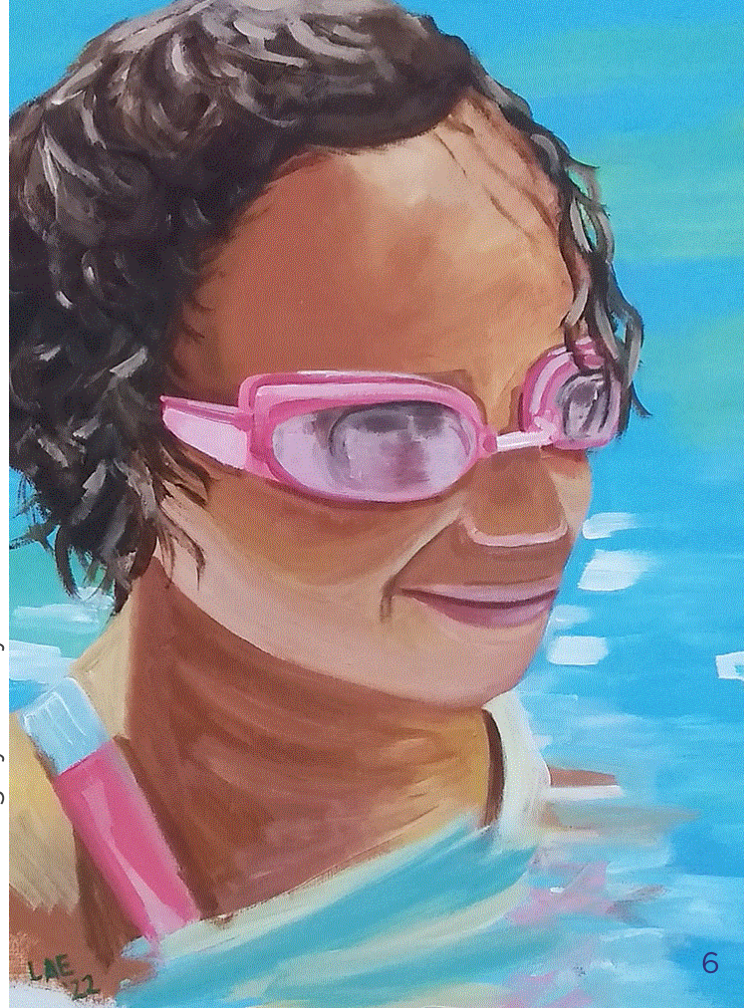
If you're new to Kawartha Lakes, welcome home!

Follow these instructions to make sure your waste and recycling are set out the right way each week:

- Waste must be set out in clear bags and contain less than 10% of recyclable items. Bags must weigh less than 40lb (18 kg).
- Waste/recycling must be set out by 7am on your day of collection (6am in designated downtown areas).
- Recycling bins are not provided. They can be purchased at one of our service centres or select libraries.
- Recycling must be loose in bins, bagged recycling is not accepted.
- Residential locations are allowed an unlimited number of recycling bins. Bins must be 22 gallons or less in size.
- Stretchy plastic film (grocery/bread/produce) must be bundled inside a small clear bag, tied closed and placed in your container recycling bin. Crinkly plastics (chip bags) are not recyclable.
- Hazardous waste, needles/syringes, electronics, construction/demolition materials will not be accepted curbside and can be brought to designated landfill sites.

We know you're excited to get your spring cleaning on but don't be too eager to throw everything away. Here's a list of items that end up in regular waste when they shouldn't:

- **Styrofoam and coffee cups** are not recyclable and need to be disposed of as waste. Coffee cup lids can be placed inside your blue recycling bin.
- **Electronics** (computers, appliances, cellphones, power tools) can be recycled at any landfill, free of charge.
- **Household hazardous waste** (paints, oil, gasoline, batteries, fertilizers, aerosol cans) can be recycled at the Fenelon or Lindsay Landfill, free of charge.
- **Fluorescent bulbs and tubes** must be disposed of as hazardous waste. All other lightbulbs can be disposed of in your household waste.
- **Large items (up to 220 lbs)** can be disposed of at a municipal landfill or can be picked up at the curb with a large item tag. Order online at www.kawarthalakes.ca/waste
- **Tires** can no longer be disposed of at landfills.

Private, Seasonal and Unassumed Roads

In order to receive waste/recycling collection, private, seasonal and unassumed roads must be properly maintained. Waste and recycling will not be collected if the driver deems the road unsafe for travel. All roads must follow the standards outlined in By-Law 2016-144 in order to receive collection. Here are a few helpful reminders to avoid any delays in service:

- Have the road plowed to a minimum of 4m wide.
- Sand or salt the road when needed.
- Make sure vegetation is cut back to a minimum of 5m/15ft high and 4m/12ft wide.
- Fill and grade potholes when needed.
- Provide a suitable turnaround area for the collection truck.

Seasonal collection resumes May 1 and ends October 27. For any questions regarding collection on private, seasonal and unassumed roads, please visit www.kawarthalakes.ca/waste

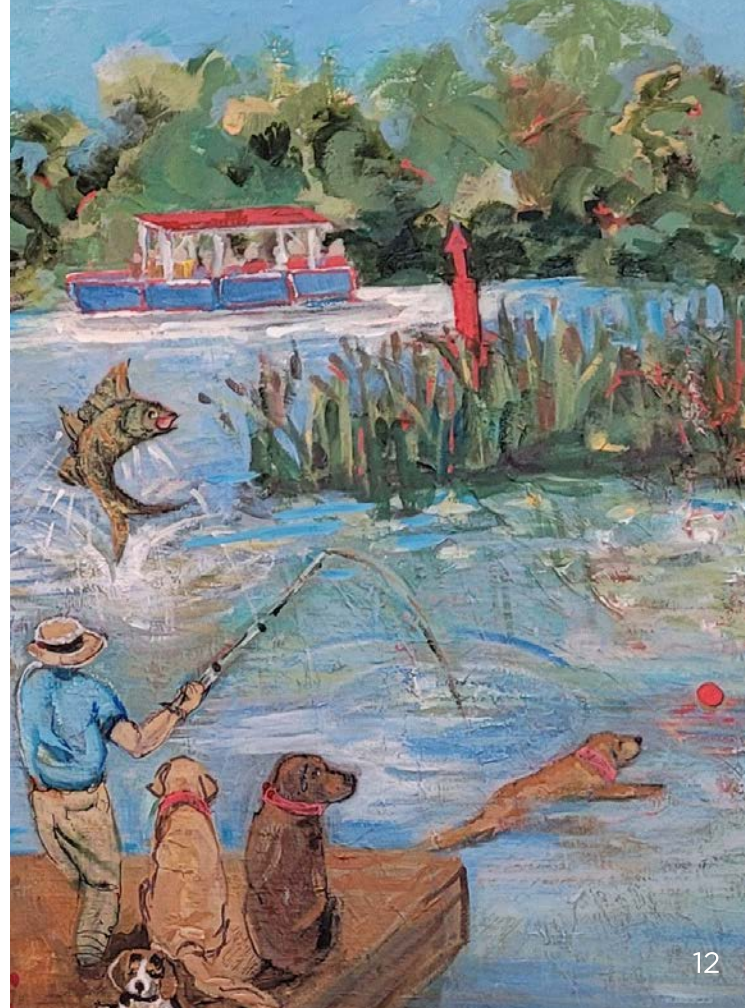

- Immediately report to the scale house where an attendant will be happy to help you.
- Follow attendant instructions.
- Follow all signs and directions.
- If you don't know where a certain material goes, ask a landfill attendant for help.
- After you drop off your material, return to the scale house to get your receipt.

On your way out, don't forget to thank the staff for the amazing job they do in keeping Kawartha Lakes green, there's no way we'd be able to do it without them!

Curbside Leaf and Yard waste collection happens once in the spring and twice in the fall. Please remember to place your leaves and bundled branches out for curbside collection on your scheduled day.

Curbside Leaf and Yard waste collection applies to low density residential locations (1 to 2 unit residences), mobile home parks, high density residential locations (3+ units) and trailer parks.

Important Reminders

- Materials must be set out curbside for 7am.
- Leaves must be stored in dry paper bags; wet paper bags will not be collected.
- Branches and twigs must be properly bundled at a size less than 3ft in length.
- Grass and any other items placed in plastic bags will not be collected.

Did you know that you could cut down on up to 30% of household waste by composting in your backyard? Backyard composting is a great way to reduce your household's carbon footprint and landfill footprint. Not only that, but you can save on buying compost and soil for your garden by making your own! Some food waste is unavoidable (bones, vegetable peels, egg shells, tea bags, coffee grounds) but a lot of food waste is avoidable and thrown out every day. Here are helpful tips on how to limit your avoidable food waste:

- Start backyard composting.
- Meal plan; make a shopping list and incorporate first-in-first-out practices in your fridge.
- Repurpose vegetable scraps. Potato peels can be made into fries or chips, chopped broccoli stalks can be used in stir fries and soups and a medley of scraps can be use to make broth.

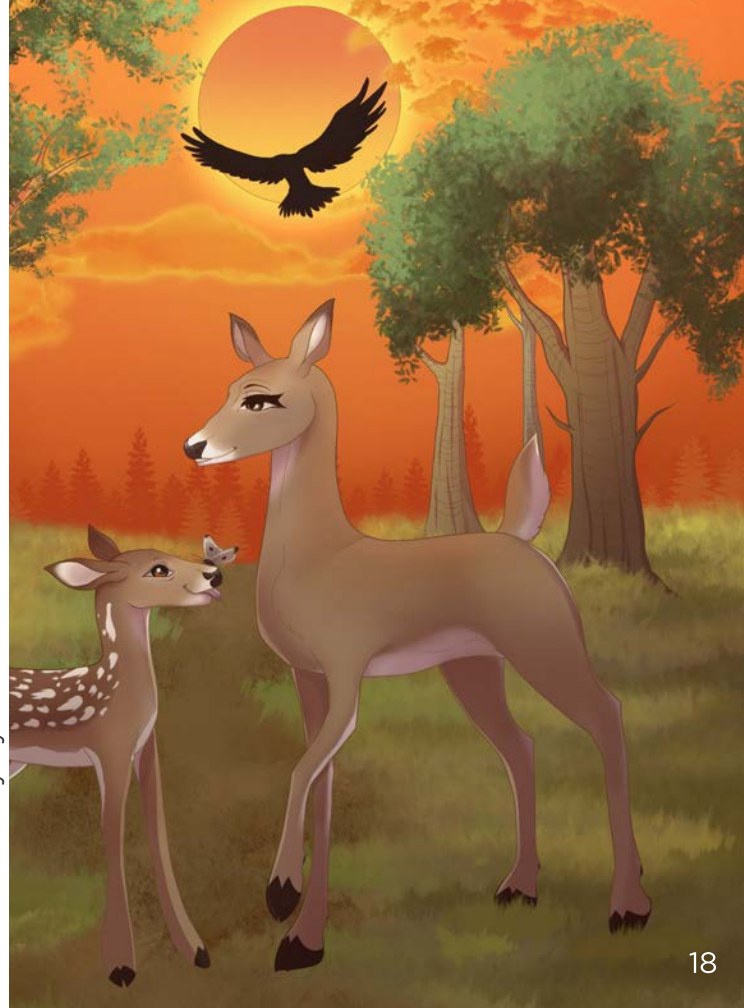
Kawartha Lakes is made up of over 250 bodies of water and has over 600km of beautiful, natural trails to explore. It's on every one of us to keep our amazing natural landscapes and green space as clean and healthy as possible for future generations.

Illegal dumping is a crime in Kawartha Lakes, as is disposing of your household waste in and/or beside public waste containers. Fines can and will be placed if you are caught doing so. Here are some easy tips on reducing litter:

- Use reusable items whenever possible (reusable grocery bags, water bottles and food containers).
- When enjoying all of the outdoor activities available across the municipality always use the “bring it in, bring it out method”. If it's waste you brought in, then it's waste you will bring out!
- Always have a spare waste bag in your car to bring items home to dispose of.
- Stay informed about your curbside collection.

September 30 is National Day for Truth and Reconciliation.

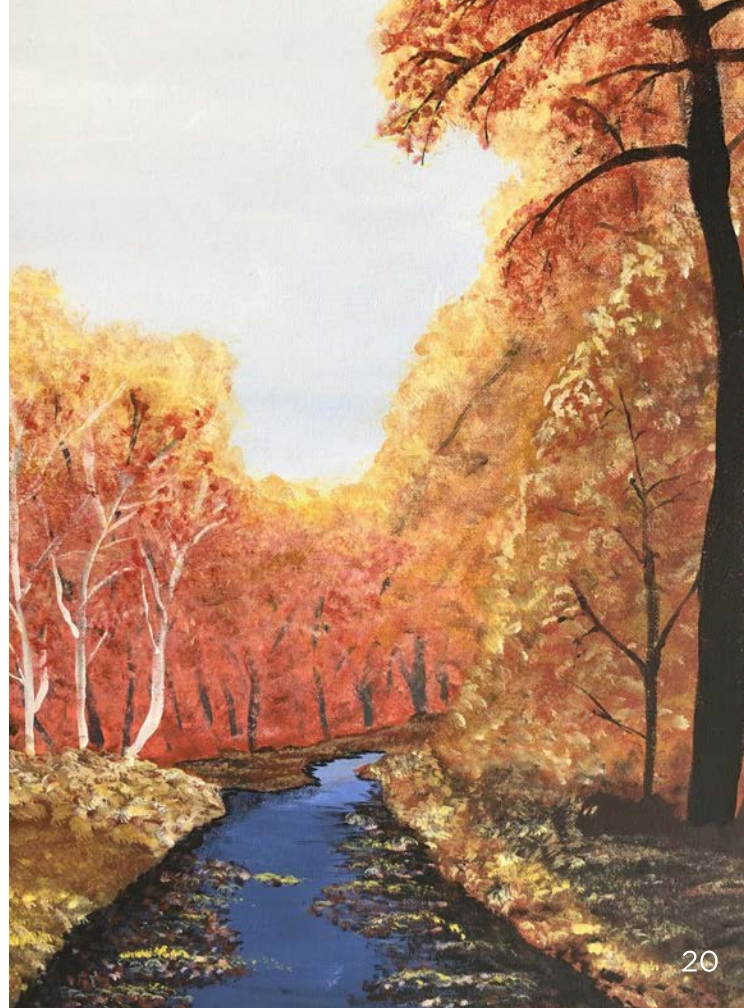

Did you know that through your local library, you can:

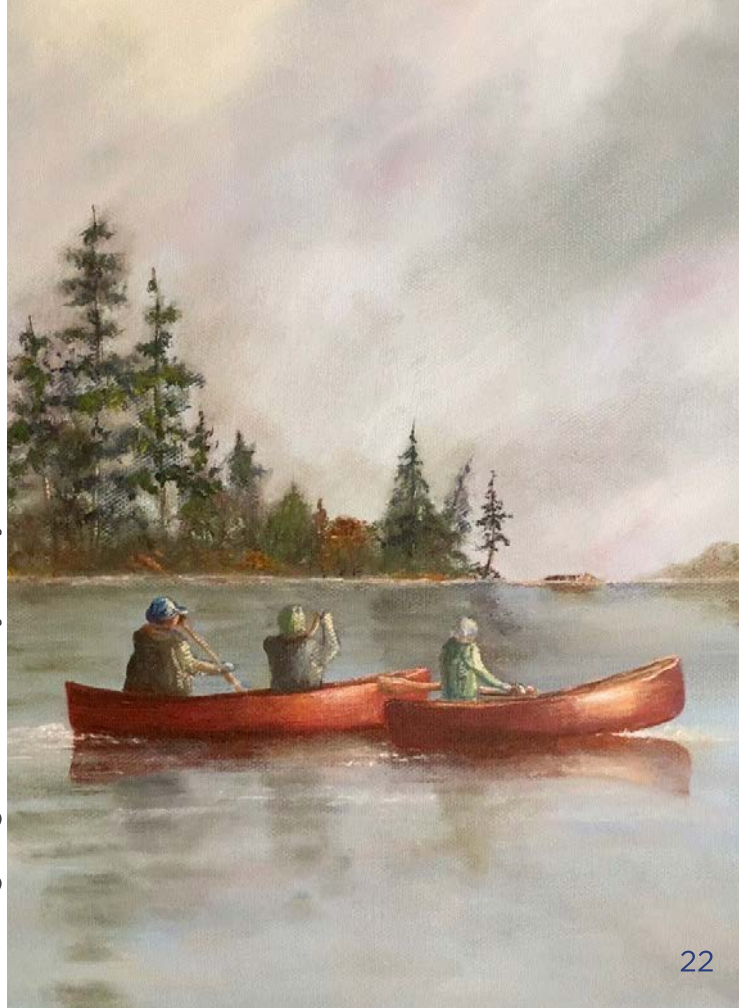
- Get outside and enjoy a Storywalk.

The Lindsay and Fenelon Landfills accept items for donation on behalf of Habitat for Humanity. Regular tipping fees apply to discard the following items:

- Bulky furniture items (dressers, desks, chairs, cabinets, etc.).
- Housewares and kitchenware (plates, pots and pans, glasses, mugs, utensils etc.).
- Construction and demolition materials (doors, windows, used wood, sinks, vanities, etc.).
- Outdoor equipment (skis, golf clubs, snowshoes, bicycles, rollerblades etc.).
- Tools (power tools, hand tools, etc.).

If donating is not an option and you can't make it to a landfill, there is a form available on the municipal website where you can buy virtual tags for curbside collection of large items, mattresses and Freon containing appliances. To learn more, visit www.kawarthalakes.ca/waste

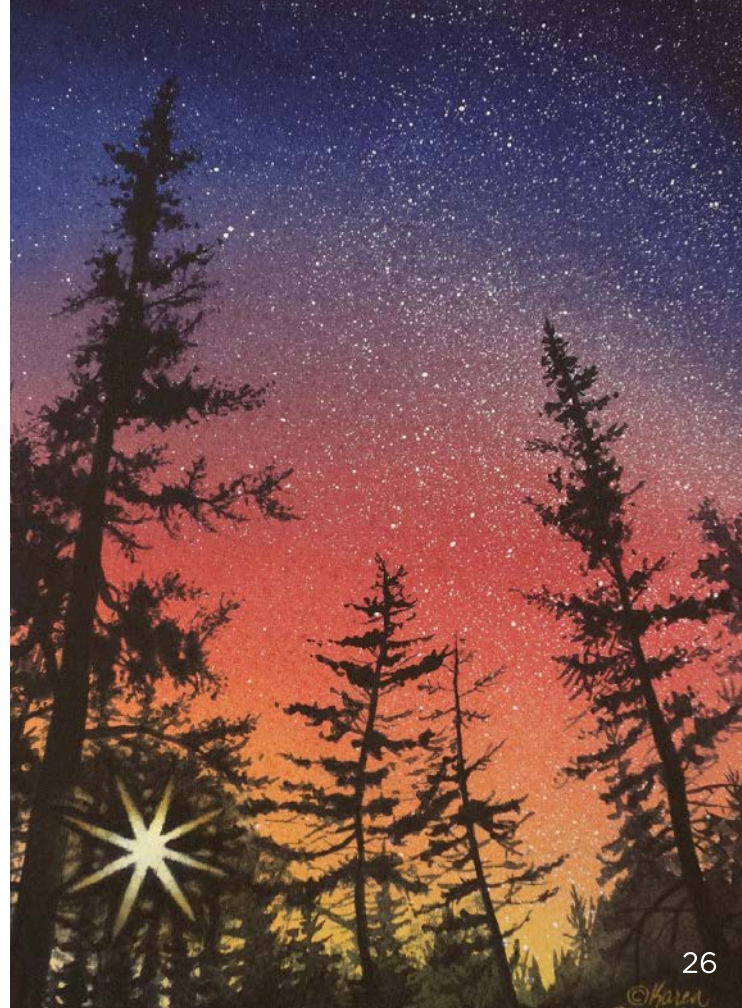
The holidays are the perfect time to consider reducing your household waste! Here are some helpful tips on how to get creative and reduce your holiday waste:

- Instead of using wrapping paper, wrap gifts in recycled or reusable materials (newspaper, fabric, scarves, reusable grocery bags or even beeswax wraps).
- Give experiences over things this year: look at excursions, outdoor adventure parks and getaways that you could enjoy together.
- At the end of the month, prop up your real Christmas tree in your backyard. Evergreens make for great habitats for birds, hold moisture and improve soil as they decompose. You can even decorate them with pinecones filled with peanut butter, and suet for birds to enjoy.

Where waste is unavoidable, keep these disposal tips in mind:

- Non-metallic wrapping paper and cards are recyclable and can be placed with paper recycling.
- Christmas trees are not collected curbside but can be disposed of as leaf and yard waste at landfills.
- Shipping packages (bubble wrap, plastic, non-paper, Styrofoam) cannot be recycled.

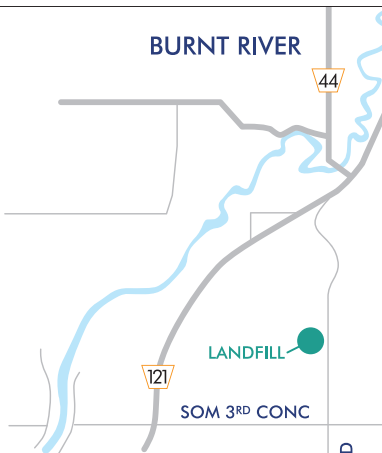
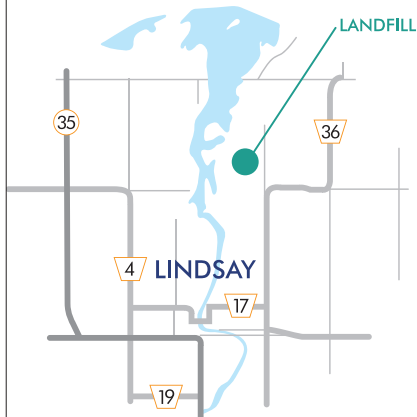

There are five landfills in Kawartha Lakes:

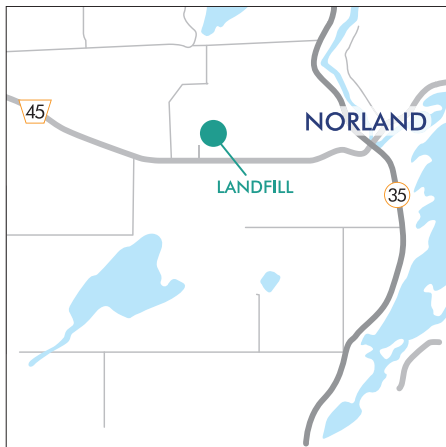
LINDSAY: North-east of Lindsay, off CKL Rd 36. Going north, turn left (west) onto Wilson Road (at first bend past the site of the correctional facility). Landfill is 0.5 km on the left hand (west) side.

Address: 51 Wilson Road



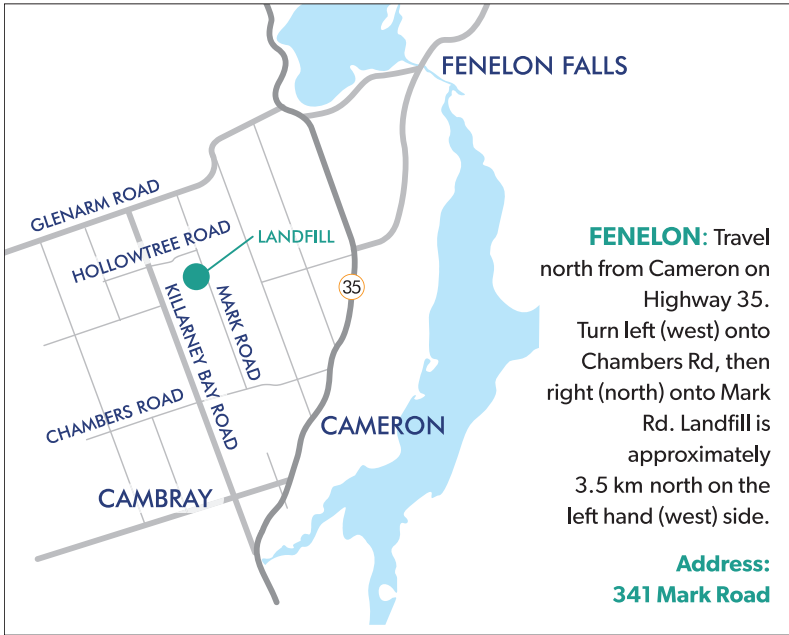
SOMERVILLE: From CKL Rd 121, turn right (south) onto Ledge Hill Rd. Landfill is approximately 2 km south on the right hand (west) side.

381 Ledge Hill Road**



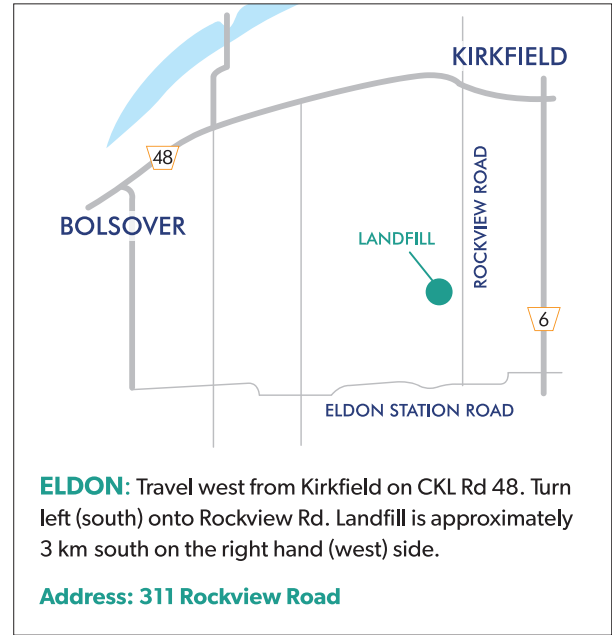
LAXTON: Located on CKL Rd 45, approximately 2 km west of Norland on the right hand (north) side.

Address: 3225 Monck Road



FENELON: Travel north from Cameron on Highway 35. Turn left (west) onto Chambers Rd, then right (north) onto Mark Rd. Landfill is approximately 3.5 km north on the left hand (west) side.

341 Mark Road



ELDON: Travel west from Kirkfield on CKL Rd 48. Turn left (south) onto Rockview Rd. Landfill is approximately 3 km south on the right hand (west) side.

Address: 311 Rockview Road

To ensure your visit to a landfill is quick and convenient:


1. Stop at the scale house on arrival for instructions
2. Follow instructions carefully (ask again, if necessary)
3. Pay attention to all site signage
4. Once material drop off is complete, return to the scale house to check out

When not in operation, access to landfill sites is restricted. Charges for trespassing will be laid.

 **Summer Landfill Hours • May 1 to October 15** • Hours may be subject to change based on operational requirements. All landfills are closed Canada Day. Lindsay Landfill is also closed Holiday Mondays (Victoria Day, Civic Holiday, Labour Day and Thanksgiving).
